



VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES

The Waterworks Museum – Hereford is actively seeking people to join the Community of Volunteers at one of Hereford’s leading visitor attractions and custodian of important aspects of our industrial heritage.

Volunteering is a great way to:

- ✓ Try something new / gain new experience
- ✓ Meet new people / make new friends
- ✓ Use your skills and experience to benefit a local charity

Located close to the banks of the River Wye on Broomy Hill, and operated wholly by Volunteers (there are no paid staff), the Waterworks Museum is open every Tuesday between 10am and 4pm, and on up to 20 in-steam days each year (Sundays and Bank Holidays).

Volunteers are asked to attend as regularly as they can but there is no fixed commitment.

Volunteer roles currently include:

- General buildings maintenance (including the painting of external exhibits)
- Events marketing and managing bookings for education and group visits (*)
- Working on the Museum website and associated social media
- Supporting the work of the Treasurer (**)
- Working in the Museum’s Archive Room (**)

* Aspects of this work can be performed away from the Museum.

** These could become development roles as part of officer succession planning.
