

WELLS AND SPRINGS OF HEREFORDSHIRE (HMSO, 1935)

The best description of the pre-Herefordshire Water Board water supply in the Bromyard rural district comes from this 1935 book published by HMSO.

Water supply arrangements would have changed over the next 25 years, but broadly water would have been taken from the same spring and well sources.
